

Sunday 7th July - Mandatory Mentor and volunteer orientation:

All mentors and volunteers are required to attend Orientation **Sunday 7th July 2019, 1pm - 4pm** for induction and training.

Monday 8th - Friday 12th July 2019 - Camp week

Camp runs from 9am-4:30pm. Specific hours for roles TBC.

Saturday 13th July 2019, 1pm - 4pm - Showcase:

The bands will perform at a concert which will run from 1pm-3pm on Saturday 13th July and you'll need to be available from **11.00am-4.00pm** that day.

Instrument Tutor:

Role description: You will work with a group of campers aged 12-17 to learn their chosen instrument. Classes will likely involve a combination of team-teaching a group of 5-10 girls and solo teaching in smaller groups with occasional one-on-one instruction. Instructors are responsible for working with other teachers to plan lessons, teaching and creating a supportive learning environment for the campers. Campers will have varying levels of musical experience. There are two instrument tutors for each instrument: Vocals, Guitar, Bass, Keyboards and Drums.

You'll need to be present Monday - Friday during the programme (hours TBC). You will need to be available for mandatory orientation Sunday 7th July 1pm - 4pm and you need to be available for the showcase Saturday 13th July to support the campers.

Band Coach:

Role description: You will look after a band of up to five campers that is formed on the first day of camp. You'll guide the band through playing together and writing an original song to perform at the end of the programme. You will work alongside a "band manager" to support and assist the band. The coaches provide help and guidance in all aspects of working as a collaborative creative team: setting up, tuning, songwriting, learning how to play together, figuring out stage moves, etc. The coaches may also be called upon to mediate band disputes, as well as note specific positive behaviours for later recognition. The band coaches generally have musical experience.

You'll need to be present Monday - Friday during the programme (hours TBC). You will need to be available for mandatory orientation Sunday 7th July 1pm - 4pm and you need to be available for the showcase Saturday 13th July to support your band.

Band Manager:

Role description: You will work alongside the “band coach” to look after a band of up to five campers that is formed on the first day of camp. You’ll help the band work on their songs and provide general support and assistance. The managers provide help and guidance in all aspects of working as a collaborative creative team: setting up, tuning, songwriting, learning how to play together, figuring out stage moves, etc. The managers may also be called upon to mediate band disputes, as well as note specific positive behaviours for later recognition. The band managers generally have experience with children.

You’ll need to be present Monday - Friday during the programme (hours TBC). You will need to be available for mandatory orientation Sunday 7th July 1pm - 4pm and you need to be available for the showcase Saturday 13th July to support your band.

Music volunteer:

Role description:

- You will work closely with **Band Mentors**, who lead the band practices and instrument lessons.
- You will help out during band practices and instrument lessons if a class needs an extra hand.
- You may be called on if a **Band Mentor** falls ill or needs to tap out for a bit.
- You’ll help set up instruments and reconfigure band rooms for band practice and instrument instruction and help with load-in/out on showcase day as well as helping the Gear Coordinator on Friday to put the rooms back to original state.
- Help tune instruments, troubleshoot gear, and keep track of instruments and gear.
- Sound help for lunchtime performers.

You will need to be available for mandatory orientation Sunday 7th July 1pm - 4pm.

General Volunteer:

Role description:

- General Volunteers are the cogs that turn the wheel of camp!
- You’ll help with general admin: organise daily attendance sheets, assist with paperwork, meet and greet campers and parents
- Help to set up the venue, assist with morning tea and lunch and housekeeping
- Supervise, provide directions and extra support to campers

- May involve some errands: picking up food donations, doing supply runs, etc.
- Helping with our social media accounts on the week
- Offering help during workshops and morning warm up.

You will need to be available for mandatory orientation Sunday 7th July 1pm - 4pm.

PHOTOGRAPHER

**No musical experience necessary. Flexible hours are available to suit your schedule.*

This volunteer is responsible for taking each band's official band photo and wandering around taking photos of all of the activities and action happening during camp, and sending them to staff or hosting them online somewhere they can be accessible campers. This volunteer must provide their own equipment. Band members will sign a media release form before camp.

SHOWCASE SUPPORT

**No musical experience necessary. Must be available on Saturday July 13th, from 11am-5pm.*

Various roles are available covering roadie and ground crew responsibilities. Help prepare campers to go onstage, move gear around, hand out programmes, run small errands, and help our Showcase will run smoothly!

NURSE

**No musical experience necessary.*

We are in need of registered nurses to be on-site during the camp week, just in case!

Gear Coordinator

*Flexible hours. *Musical experience necessary*

Responsibilities include setting up the camp site, re-configuring rooms for band practice every day, helping with load-in/out on showcase days, etc. We need people who can be at camp for all or most days and provide continuity throughout the week. Great for the organised person who wants to help out at camp and learn a bit about what happens behind-the-scenes!

Sound engineer:

We have local bands play every lunchtime Monday-Friday for the campers and need a sound engineer for these sessions approximately from 11am-1:30pm as well as for the Showcase on Saturday 13th July - The camper bands will perform at a concert which will run from 1pm-3pm and you'll need to be available from 9.00am- 5.00pm that day.

Campers Welfare

Role description:

- You'll provide counsel and support to campers with any personal issues that may arise or if any additional emotional support for campers or mentors is needed.
- Our curriculum covers conflict resolution and team-building and many of our mentors working with campers every day are experienced with working with teenagers but we're aiming to be supported by registered counsellors or mental health professionals.
- We will have a designated space available for you to use for counselling/providing support.

You will need to be available for mandatory orientation Sunday 7th July 1pm - 4pm.

Workshop Facilitator:

Workshops should be as inclusive as possible and coordinate with GR!P values. There should be a good variety of learning covered. There is a lot of listening and patience being practiced by campers during the week - movement based and creatively interactive workshops have proven successful in the past. **The workshops have to be EMPOWERING and be group involvement orientated.** In the past we have had workshops on Zine making, Tshirt Making, Self Defence, Music Herstory, Rhythm, Punk Rock Aerobics, Dance, Yoga and Mindfulness, Poetry and Lyrics, Performance confidence, DIY music, Beautiful Minds, Team Building, Pretty Smart.
